Quota places are allocated to athletes by name.

C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions).

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, plus the rules of World Skate, may participate in the LA28 Olympic Games.

Additional IF eligibility criteria

C.1. Athletes must also comply with the following criteria:

- They must be listed by name in the World Skateboarding Ranking (WSR) on the World Skate [website](#) as of **11 June 2028**.
- They must be a recognised member of their National Federation, in line with the national governing body standards and procedures.
- All competing athletes at the LA28 Olympic Games have must have been born on or before 31 December 2014 (i.e. be at least 14 years old or reaching this age of age or older on 31 December 2028), with the date validated by the passport used for ACR registration.

D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

The women's park and street events and men's park and street events will each feature exactly 22 athletes: in each event, 20 will qualify through the World Skateboarding Ranking, one universality quota place will be allocated, and one host country place will be allocated to the highest-ranked host country athlete if such an athlete has not already otherwise qualified.

The WSR and event calendar can be found here. The WSR criteria will also be released here before the start of the Olympic qualification period.</p> <p>*The Olympic Qualifier Series (OQS) will include Skateboarding Park. The same tier of events will be delivered for Street by World Skate and these events will be awarded OQS tier ranking points.</p> <p>WSR points can be earned between 11 June 2026 and 11 June 2028 inclusive, across two phases:</p> <p>Phase 1 – 11 June 2026 to 31 March 2028</p> <p>For the events that are part of the first phase of the qualification system, National Federations are free to register athletes within the participation quotas set by World Skate and detailed in the official event bulletins.</p> <p>Phase 2 – 31 March to 11 June 2028</p> <p>For events in the second phase of the qualification system, National Federations can only register eligible athletes who have received a nominal quota place based on their achievements during Phase 1.</p> <p>A total of 44 athletes per discipline and gender, with a maximum quota of six athletes per NOC, will have access to Phase 2 competitions.</p> <p>The nominal quota for Phase 2 will be allocated by World Skate based on the WSR standings and in line with the criteria released before the start of Phase 1 by the International Federation.</p> <p>Details on WSR points allocation are determined by World Skate and available at Olympic Qualifying System.</p> <p>Athletes eligible for a quota place for the Olympic Games will be selected by name from the WSR as of 11 June 2028, following the conclusion of all eligible WSR events. There will be a maximum quota of three athletes per NOC per gender and per event until a total of 20 athletes is reached, including continental places.</p>

Each of the five continents of the Olympic Movement is guaranteed one athlete per event, if such athletes have not qualified in accordance with the above qualification criteria (continental places). These continental places will be allocated to the highest-ranked athlete(s) in the World Skateboarding Ranking from the continent(s) without representation, if such athletes are listed in the WSR. If there is no athlete from a continent listed on the WSR on 11 June 2028, the WSR from 31 March 2028 will be used.

D.2. Host country places

The host country is guaranteed one athlete in each of the women's and men's events if it does not already have athletes qualified. The athlete selected by name will be the highest-ranked athlete from the host country listed in the World Skateboarding Ranking as of 11 June 2028. In the event that no athlete from the host country is listed in the WSR on 11 June 2028, the WSR from 31 March 2028 will be used. If there is still no athlete listed, World Skate will, in collaboration with the host country's NOC, identify which athlete(s) will represent the host country.

D.3. Universality places

One men's and one women's universality place per event is available to eligible NOCs at the LA28 Olympic Games.

On 1 October 2027, the IOC will invite all eligible NOCs to submit their requests for universality places. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests is 15 January 2028. The Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of universality places to the relevant NOCs after the qualification period.

Athlete eligibility:

To be eligible to receive a universality place, athletes must satisfy one of two specific ranking criteria based on the WSR. The eligibility threshold is determined by the better (lower figure) ranking position resulting from these two criteria:

- 1) Being ranked within the top 50% of the total ranked positions in the WSR.
- 2) Being ranked within the top 50 positions overall.

For example: if the WSR for women's street has 80 ranked positions, the eligibility threshold would be set at the 40th ranking position.

If there is no athlete listed on the WSR on 11 June 2028, the WSR from 31 March 2028 will be used.

E. CONFIRMATION

E.1. Confirmation of quota places

World Skate will publish the WSR [here](#) during the entire qualification period prior to the qualification deadline. The qualification period will end on 11 June 2028, and World Skate will update the final WSR on 14 June 2028, following the conclusion of all eligible WSR events.

Upon publication of the final WSR, World Skate will send confirmation of the quota places obtained in accordance with the qualification criteria, outlined in section D above, to the respective NOCs, by no later than 22:00 Central European Standard Time on 15 June 2028.

Each NOC will have to confirm to World Skate the athlete places that they will use by no later than 22:00 Central European Standard Time on 19 June 2028.

As of 22:00 Central European Standard Time on 20 June 2028, World Skate will commence the reallocation of all unused quota places.

E.2. Confirmation of host country places

The host country must confirm in writing to World Skate the use of its host country places by 22:00 Central European Standard Time on 19 June 2028.

F. REALLOCATION

F.1. Reallocation of unused quota places

If an allocated quota place is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota places deadline or is declined by the NOC, or if it cannot be assigned for any other reason, it will be reallocated by name to the highest-ranked athlete in the WSR of 14 June 2028 who has not already qualified, adhering to the maximum quota per NOC per event and respecting continental representation (as determined under sections B and D above). World Skate will reallocate all unused quota places by no later than 17:00 Central European Standard Time on 20 June 2028.

F.2. Reallocation of unused host country places

Any unused host country place will be reallocated by name to the highest-ranked athlete in the WSR of 14 June 2028 who has not already qualified, adhering to the maximum quota per NOC per event, by no later than 17:00 Central European Standard Time on 20 June 2028.

F.3. Reallocation of unused universality places

Any unused universality place will be reallocated by name to the highest-ranked athlete in the World Skateboarding Ranking of 14 June 2028 who has not already qualified, adhering to the maximum quota per NOC per event, by no later than 17:00 Central European Standard Time on 20 June 2028.
